

# Interviewing a Nurse With Experience

For this phase of [Nike's DTC Distribution Strategy](#), you will interview a nurse with experience in different aspects of nursing. This conversation will provide you with valuable information about the practice of nursing today and how it was approached by seasoned nurses in the past. Carefully review the Course Project Milestone 2 Guidelines prior to completing this template, and pay attention to all rubric requirements.

## Phase 1: Selected Nurse Information

This RN may be a family member, friend, colleague, acquaintance, manager, former instructor or even your grandmother. Remember, you are not conducting a formal interview with this nurse, but rather a conversation spanning multiple modalities, including face to face, video chat, and telephone. Regardless of the medium selected, this phase of the project is an excellent way to get your ear to the grindstone, learn something new, and earn some extra credit on the course!

In the [BUS FPX3022 Assessment 1](#) you must select a date, time and location to conduct your conversation. Be sure to get permission from your selected RN (source the statement on the template for this purpose) before you go. This phase of the project is also the most fun, so be prepared to share the experience with colleagues and family. You will be amazed by how much information can be gleaned from the right question and answer session.

## Phase 2: Conversation with the Selected Nurse

A conversation with a seasoned nurse can be an important experience for nursing students. It can help them to build a better understanding of their chosen nursing practice and trigger new information that may benefit their professional practice. It can also help them to see how their practice relates to a seasoned nurse's history, as well as a living nurse's current practice.

Phase 2 trials are carried out on a larger population of people than in phase 1 (50-300). These trials are designed to assess the effectiveness and safety of a drug and compare it with other [BUS FPX3022 Assessment 1: Nike's DTC Distribution Strategy](#) that are already in use, or to test a dummy drug (placebo). They can also help find out about any side effects that doctors may not have been aware of in earlier trials.

For this project, you must conduct a phase 2 Conversation with the Selected Nurse, using the format (audio, video, or typed) that you agreed to in Phase 1. Be sure to review the instructions on the template and tutorial and submit the Conversation by the due date.

# Phase 3: Reflection Paper

Reflective writing is a great way to explore your experiences in a course and how these may or may not influence your future career. It is also a great opportunity to show your professors that you're paying attention to the material and demonstrating your ability to engage with it in an active and meaningful manner.

As with any other assignment in this course, it's important to read the instructions closely. This is especially true of the Phase 3: Reflection Paper, which should be completed by Sunday at 11:59 p.m. MT, and is worth 225 points out of a total project weight of 600.

The best way to approach this task is to do a little bit of research and find out what the instructor is looking for. This can be done via a Google search or a perusal of the course [NR 393 Week 4](#), which includes an assignment tab with specific guidelines and a rubric. This will ensure that you don't waste your time and efforts on a rehash of the same old content.

# Phase 4: Presentation

Marvel Phase 4 has been a very exciting era for the MCU. It's been filled with new characters, locations, and heroes, and has cracked open the Marvel multiverse.

While Phase 4 did have some issues that made it feel like a more meandering or aimless phase than the previous ones, some of the films and shows are actually quite good. For example, *Black Widow* is an excellent spy thriller that takes a look at Natasha Romanoff's past relationships before she became an Avenger.

It also has some comic book elements, but doesn't fully capitalize on them. It's a frustrating [best nursing essay writing service](#) to be in, because it means that both comics fans and relative newcomers will miss out on some of the zany insanity that made these stories so fun to watch.

One of the big themes that Phase 4 is tackling is trauma. After the back-to-back traumatic events of *Avengers: Infinity War* and *Avengers: Endgame*, it's no wonder that the MCU is taking a lot of time to examine grief, loss, and trauma in this arc.
